

Cutwork – Reversible Table Topper

- Machine-in good working order. Bring the one you will really work with at home if possible.
- Manual for machine. Please know how to set up your machine for free motion before class by reading your manual.
- Free Motion or Darning foot for your machine- open-toed is best. Bring a closed toe darning foot if that's what you have. The foot usually has a spring on it. You do need this for the class-if you're not sure, please call your machine's dealer to make sure you have the correct one.
- Put the free motion foot on your machine before you come and lower the needle to make sure it fits and works with your machine. Your quilt sandwich should move freely under a lowered presser foot. I want to make sure you have the right one!
- Blue wash out marker.
- 2 spools of quality thread-prefer Aurifil #50 or other lighter weight thread. You will want your thread choices to show up nicely on the fabric you choose. You can use a high quality polyester thread also.
- 1 wound bobbin of one of your thread choices.
- Extra bobbin-empty.
- Ruler 18-24" long (students can share-we only use it once)
- Sharp, short, sturdy scissors for the cutwork.
- 2 different 30" widths of fabric - quality quilting cotton, solid or near solid.
- Enough 2-sided fusible product to fuse your 30" x 44" fabric (I use Misty Fuse).
- Size 90/14 topstitch needles for your machine.
- Scissors for snipping threads.
- 15 sheets of letter size paper for practice.

NOTE: 15 Minutes of homework before class:

- Fuse your two quilting fabrics together with a thin 2-sided fusible product like Steam-a-Seam2 or Misty Fuse. Fuse with right sides out and the fusible between.
- We will break for a ½ hour lunch; it's best to bring one.

Bring only if you already have (don't rush out and buy them):

- The bed extender that came with your machine or Sew Steady table.
- Teflon machine bed cover such as Supreme Slider
- Straight stitch throat plate.
- Quilting gloves of your choice-no, you don't *have* to have them but it can help!
