

Cutwork – Reversible Table Topper or Scarf

- Machine - in good working order. Bring the one you will really quilt with at home if possible. You may need to increase your presser foot pressure; class-sized machines usually don't have this feature, but full-sized machines do.
- Manual for machine. Please know how to set up your machine for free motion before class by reading your manual.
- Free Motion foot for your machine - open-toed is best. Bring a closed toe foot if that's what you have. The foot usually has a spring on it. You do need this for the class; if you're not sure, please call your machine's dealer to make sure you have the correct one.
- Put the free motion foot on your machine before you come and lower the needle to make sure it fits and works with your machine. Your quilt sandwich should move freely under a lowered presser foot.
- Blue wash out marker.
- 2 spools of quality thread. You will want your thread color choices to show up nicely on the fabric you choose.
- 1 wound bobbin.
- Extra bobbin - empty.
- Ruler 18-24" long (students can share - we only use it once)
- Sharp, short, stubby scissors for the cutwork (see page 2 of this supply list).
- Table topper: 2 different 30" widths of fabric - quality quilting cotton, solid or near solid.

OR

- Scarf: Two 14" x 72" cuts of rayon batik. Please note – quilting cotton is NOT a good choice for a scarf as it is too stiff. Another drapery fabric might work.
- Enough 2-sided fusible product to fuse your either your table topper fabric or scarf cut (I strongly prefer Misty Fuse as it does not alter the hand of the fabric).
- Topstitch needles sized appropriately for your thread.
- Scissors for snipping threads.
- 15 sheets of letter size paper for practice.

NOTE: 15 Minutes of homework before class:

- Fuse your two fabric cuts together with a thin 2-sided fusible product like Steam-a-Seam2 or Misty Fuse. Fuse with right sides out and the fusible between.

Bring if you already have:

- The bed extender that came with your machine or Sew Steady table.
- Teflon machine bed cover such as Supreme Slider.
- Straight stitch throat plate.
- Something to make your hands grippy – gloves, paddles, etc.
